Village Board Meeting Notes



September Board Meeting: The Village Board met on Wednesday September 9, 2009. Several issues were discussed. The Village accountant, Steve Rishel, was present at the meeting and discussed next year's budget. The Board approved a budget for next year which included raising the mil levy to .37%. The Park Board Report was given by Tanya Brown. Mrs. Brown expressed a desire to earmark monies earned through Park Board fundraisers to specifically pay for park equipment and not to pay for other Park expenses, such as the costs of mowing the parks. An ordinance increasing the water rates to \$27.00 a month and the sewer rates to \$31.00 per month was ratified by the Board. The ordinance will become effective November 1, 2009. The Chairman of the Board appointed a committee consisting of Tom Pike, Elmer Henderson, Chris Keene, Cal Keene, and Barbara Gaughan to review the Mr. Tom Meyer's proposal for a retail meat processing plant in Union. Near the end of the meeting, the Board went into closed session where Deb McWha gave notice of her resignation as Village Clerk effective October 1, 2009. Steve McWha, the Village Manager, also stated that he would be resigning as soon as the Village could find a suitable replacement.

October Board Meeting: The Village Board met on October 14, 2009. At the meeting, Chairman Terry McClane swore in the new Village clerk Melissa Hansen. The Chairman commented that the Board had approximately 13 applications for the clerk position and selected Ms. Hansen from the 11 very qualified candidates in which the Board interviewed on October 12th. The Village received a letter from Tom Meyer's attorney, David Chebatoris, stating that Mr. Meyer is no longer interested in locating a retail meat processing plant in Union. The Village Manager, Steve McWha, stated that the water pump house is in poor condition and will need to be replaced sometime in the future. At the Board's request, Mr. McWha agreed to stay on as the Village Manger through the winter months to handle the sewer and water. The Board voted to make a Park Board Project Fund as a separate line item on the monthly budget, where any fundraising monies will be accounted for and separated from the general park board budget that includes the costs of mowing and maintaining the parks.

The Village of Union Needs a New Logo!

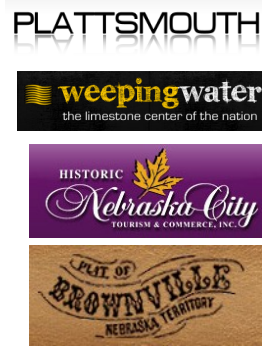
